Codes of Conduct

Club Officials, Coaches & Volunteers

Cattewater Pilot Gig Club expects all officials and volunteers to:

- Consider the well-being and safety of participants before the development of performance.
- Develop an appropriate working relationship with performers, based on mutual trust and respect.
- Make sure all activities are appropriate to the age, ability and experience of those taking part
- Promote the positive aspects of the sport (e.g. fair play friendship and respect) and the benefits of participation both socially and in competition
- Display consistently high standards of behaviour and appearance
- Follow all guidelines laid down by the national governing body and the club
- Where necessary hold the appropriate, valid qualifications and insurance cover
- Never exert undue influence over performers to obtain personal benefit or reward
- Never condone rule violations, rough play or the use of prohibited substances
- Encourage participants to enjoy their time spent within the club whether taking part in training, recreational rowing or racing
- Accept responsibility for their actions
- Display high standards in use of language and manner

Parents/Guardians

Cattewater Pilot Gig Club expects that parents/guardians will:

- Encourage their child to learn the rules and play within them.
- Discourage unfair play and arguing with officials.
- Help their child to recognise good performance, not just results.
- Never force their child to take part in sport.
- Set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding the good performances of all.
- Never punish or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes.
- Publicly accept officials' judgements.
- Support their child's involvement and help them to enjoy their sport.

All Members

Cattewater Pilot Gig Club expects that all members will:

- Play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- All members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions as set out by the club committee and inform their coach/coxswain if they are going to be late.
- Wherever possible team members unable to make a training session will find a replacement rower and / or uniform the coxswain in plenty of time of their circumstances.
- Discourage unfair play and arguing with officials.

- Members are not permitted to consume inappropriate amounts of alcohol prior to training or racing sessions where they may put others at risk.
- Junior members are not permitted to smoke, drink alcohol or take drugs at any time while under the care of the club.
